## POPPIES FOR REMEMBRANCE

On November 11th 1918, at 11am, the First World War ended with an Armistice between the Allies and Germany. To commemorate this time in history, the school will hold a silence at the war graves on Friday 11th November, at 11.00am. The children will process to the war graves to observe a silence at 11am. The children will lay a silk poppy on each of the war graves. These poppies are flown to us each year, all the way from the Returned Services League (RSL) in Geraldton, Australia.

## PEACE WALK – THANK YOU

Last term, we held a successful Peace Walk on World Smile Day. Mr Alan Blake has asked me to pass on his thanks to the whole school community for taking part in our walk in memory of Mrs Blake. ## CURRICULUM EVENINGS MEETINGS FOR PARENTS & CARERS:

We value our strong relationship with parents, and following last term’s well-attended Back to School Nights, curriculum evenings are taking place this term for each class. These workshops will provide essential curriculum and assessment information for parents, and share ways to help you support your child with their learning. We kindly ask that children do not attend.



## SCHOOL UNIFORM

We are currently in the process of finalising our School Uniform Policy. Once the final draft is complete, we will be circulating this to parents and carers and asking for your feedback. Following our consultation about our uniform at the end of last year, we are trying to reduce the number of branded items, so that the majority of our uniform can be purchased from a wide variety of retailers. This will mean phasing out our green PE hooded top. Your feedback indicated that they do not wear, or wash, as well as the school jumpers, and they are tight to get on and off. The children will be able to wear their school jumper or cardigan on PE days.

## WELLIES IN SCHOOL



As part of our school equipment list, we do kindly request that the children keep a pair of wellington boots in school. This is so that we can make use of the school field and our natural surroundings all year round. As we are entering the winter months, the children must have wellies in school to be able to go onto the field at break and lunch times. This will ensure we keep the children's school shoes clean and help us keep the school environment clean and tidy. If they do not have wellies, they will not be able to use the field and will have to stay on the playground. Please do speak to us if, for any reason, you are unable to provide wellies for your child/children as we may be able to help. Furthermore, if you have any spare/old wellies at home, that you're happy to donate to the school, we would be extremely grateful as we could keep some spare pairs in school.

## WELLY RACKS

We have purchased new welly racks for the school to replace our current wooden ones, which are showing signs of wear-and-tear. Our current wooden welly racks were built for the school by Charlie Purser's grandad and we have made great use of them for a number of years. Some of the racks are still in good condition, or could be cut down to be used for families at home. If you would be interested in recycling our wellies racks and using them at home, please do come and ask. The new welly racks are on wheels, so that they children's wellies can be brought into school each evening. This will help protect them from the elements during the colder months and keep them warm for the children.



## HEALTHY SNACKS

A reminder that all the children should have a healthy snack during our morning break. Auckland, Brisbane and Canberra Class all have free fruit, through the government's fruit and veg scheme. It is important that the children at Key Stage Two also choose a health option, for their own health and so that it is fair for all the children. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.
