VE Day 80th Anniversary



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Thursday 8th May marks the 80th Anniversary of Victory in Europe Day, which symbolises the end of the conflict during World War Two. It is a day etched in the memory of everyone who witnessed it and a way to remember the sacrifices made by previous generations.

We have arranged for a local historian to come into school and talk to Key Stage Two about VE Day and its significance. We are also planning to mark this occasion as a whole school during Arts Week. We will share this information with you when we have finalised the plans.



As a school, we are planning to hold a military themed 'Forces Day' in Term 6. This is to celebrate the important work that the armed forces do and to allow the children to learn more about what they do for the country and the world.

Mrs Claire Blair has already sent out a letter to our military families and we have been delighted with the positive responses we have received and the willingness to help us plan and organise this experience for the children.

There will be a meeting on Friday 25th April at 3.30pm for anyone who wishes to help. This will be a chance to collate ideas together and begin to plan for the day. We look forward to seeing you there if you're interested in supporting this event.



ANZAC Day and Service

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This year ANZAC Day falls on **Friday 25th April** and we will be marking the occasion with a service in the church at 9.30am. ANZAC Day marks a proud and longstanding tradition at the school. For 109 years, the children at Sutton Veny School have paid their respects for the fallen, who are laid to rest in the churchyard, by laying specially made posies on the graves as part of our ANZAC Service.

Each year, we kindly ask our families for donations of flowers to make the posies and we are always overwhelmed by your generosity. Please could we ask that any donations are bought into school on **Thursday 24th April**, as the children will be making posies on this day, ahead of the service. Thank you in advance for supporting this special tradition.

The children are very welcome to make ANZAC biscuits to bring in for the service if they wish. Last year, we shared the left overs out and the children took some home with them. The recipe is on the school website and can be accessed by clicking here.

All the children must wear their full school uniform on **Friday 25**th **April** for our ANZAC Service. If they have PE on this day, you can send in a pair of trainers for them to change in to. Thank you.

NATIONAL STANDARD ASSESSMENT TESTS (SATs)

National assessment tests always take place in Terms 5 & 6. The children in Nelson Class will be taking part in these assessments this term. The Key Stage One assessments for Canberra Class are now optional, so are no longer a statutory requirement for schools. In Key Stage Two, the assessments for Nelson Class will take place during the week beginning **Monday 12th May** and we wish Year 6 the best of luck.



eSchools and Parent Pay

At the end of April, we will no longer use eSchools for our school communication as we are trying to reduce the number of apps that we use in school. Instead, we will be sending out all of our school communication through Parent Pay from the end of this month.



School Attendance Reminder

Regular and sustained school attendance has a significant impact on a child's social, emotional and academic development. As a school we aim to have a minimum school attendance figure of 96%. A child's attendance becomes a concern when it falls below 95% and becomes a serious concern if it drops below 90%, which is when a child becomes classed, by the Government, as persistently absent from school. Children only get one chance at each lesson in school and poor attendance means that gaps will appear in their knowledge and understanding, which impacts negatively on their progress. Missing time in school also has an impact on their social and emotional development. The table below shows the relationship between attendance percentages, days off and learning hours lost.
